Local MEP speaks to Sixth Form students in Worcester

Local Conservative MEP, Philip Bradbourn, met with Sixth Form students from Worcester Sixth Form College and King's School Worcester on Friday 9th October in order to talk about his role in the European Parliament and his work for constituents in Worcestershire. Both visits were highly successful and the students were enthused and engaging, asking questions which ranged from the Common Agricultural Policy and its' effects for Worcestershire farmers, to the Lisbon Treaty and how it will affect British people.

He also spoke to students at King's School and headmaster Tim Keyes about their upcoming participation in the Comenius programme, an inter-European educational programme focussing on cooperation, diversity, and cultural exchange.

Mr. Bradbourn, said:

"It is always a pleasure to visit schools and Sixth Forms to engage with students about European politics, particularly when a lively discussion ensues. I hope students were able to take something out of my visit and have an understanding of how the work my colleagues and I do in Brussels and Strasbourg affects their interests in Worcester. It is definitely beneficial for me as an MEP to take on board the views of young people and how they see Britain's role in the European Union.

I will be supporting the efforts of King's School in the Comenius programme in the coming months especially with their planned visit to the Parliament in Strasbourg next year.

I am keen to maintain my links with these two excellent schools and look forward to visiting the students again in the future."
